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Big Night Live Manual

Introduction

Big Night Live has been created with families and adults alike in mind. The presentation of Big Night Live comes after Play Live every evening and will consist of various cabarets, singers, challenges and game shows with lots of prizes to be given away. The content below is designed to either fill a whole evenings worth of entertainment or just a few minutes here and there depending on what outside acts have been booked.

The content is broken down into 3 sections. Bring It On, Fillers and Features. The content is designed to be a kit of parts so the Holiday Heroes can hand pick what show they would like to put together that evening. You will find that there's enough content to have a different show each evening. It is down to the Holiday Hero's to plan the shows based around what outside acts have already been booked and how busy the venues are. As you read further on in the manual it will be explained in more detail how each section should be presented.

For the presentation of Big Night Live you will be wearing your Away Resorts evening uniform. Always ensure you are looking, smart, fresh and presentable. And don't forget your "3 C's" Content, Contact and Commitment!



Bring it on is designed as an ice breaker for the beginning of the evening entertainment. A way for the host's to get to know their audience a little better. The Bring It On challenges are designed for host to go out into the audience and challenge them to a head to head, or table to table challenge. If the audience members beat the host then they will win spot prize. The better the hosts are at these challenges, the better this section will be as it will create a bit of excitement as to who will win as the week goes on. All these challenges will be played out at the tables with the roaming camera picking up the action on the big screen.

After Eight Title

Each contestant starts with an after eight on your forehead. Using your facial muscles you have to get it from your forehead to your mouth, but if you drop it you have to start again. The first person to get it in their mouth wins. Assistant required.

Mine's Bigger than yours Title

Using 2 x steel builder's tape measures. The idea is to extend the tape as far as you can without it bending and going floppy. You will take it in turns extending the length and stating how long yours is. The winner is the person who gets it out the furthest without it breaking. Assistant Required

Fluffy Bunnies Title

Taking it in turns, the contestant and presenter has to put a marshmallow in their mouth and say "Fluffy Bunnies". This continues until one of the players gives up. Get the audience counting with you. Ensure you've got a spit bowl and tissues at the ready. Assistant required

Beer Mat Flip Title

Each player has a go at flipping and catching a beer mat from the table. If successful, you add another one to the pile continuing until one fails. Whoever successfully flips the most mats wins. 3 failed attempts and you're out.

Coin Stack Title

This is similar to the Beer Mat Flip, except that this time, you place a coin on your upturned elbow/forearm. You must hold the coin on your elbow and then flip your hand down, on that same arm, in the attempt to catch the coin. Again you add more coins until someone fails.

Don't be a donut Title

Each contestant has to eat a donut in the quickest time without licking your lips. It is much harder than it sounds. Assistant Required

Listen to the Rhythm of the Beat Title

This is a memory challenge where the presenter taps a rhythm on the table top and challenges a guest to copy it. (5 x taps, clap, tap, elbow)

Yes No Game

A simple game of yes or no. A minute is put on the clock and the host asks the challenger various questions in the attempt to make he or she say yes or no. If they don't say it within the minute then the challenger wins

Yes or No Questions

Fillers

Fillers can be played as either as a full 30 – 40 minute game show or used to fill 10 minutes between other acts depending on the rest of your evenings entertainment. Just be aware if you decide to use the fillers as a feature length gameshow then they don't double up on the content later on in the week.



The DJ will play the musical content and the host will go out to the tables with a roving camera operator. All of interaction at the tables will be fed live to the screen. We suggest doing a battle of the tables to build up some excitement. The louder the tables are, the more chance they have got of the host asking them for the answer. The DJ can keep a tally on the scores and the table with the most points at the end of the games wins. Each round has its own title, plus a Musical Mash up holding screen. It is down to the Holiday Heros to create the content. The individual rounds are as follows:

Name That Tune

A simple game of Name That Tune. 1 point for the name of the song, 1 point for the artist and / or 1 point for the name of the TV/Film it featured

Guess the Music Video

The Music video is played but without the sound. If a table knows the song they have to get the host's attention and sing the song.

Track in Disguise

The song is played but disguised with a sound treatment. For example it could be made to sound like the Chipmunks were singing the song.

Sing the Lyrics

The words and video, 'karaoke Style' will be up on the screen and participants have to sing the missing words of the song to win the points. This round we advise getting 2 people up on stage and an attempt to win points for their table.

Dancing Through Life

The DJ plays the different types of music and a representative from the table has to dance according to the type of music that played i.e. Ballet, Rock and Roll, Irish Dancing, Morris Dancing, Birdie Song. To make it clearer for the audience the name of the genre of dance will come up on the big screen.

Minute To Win IT



This section is called 'Minute To Win It'. It's made up of simple high energized games using every day house hold objects. We suggest the best way to play is to get 2 x teams of 3x people. The host introduces the game and invites the contestants on the stage. The host explains that the game is made up of 3 head to head rounds and it's down to a team captain to nominate which team mate steps up and competes in each round (think crystal maze). Each round is worth a point and the team with the most points after the 3 rounds are the winners. The action in its self will be entertaining, however it is down to the host to drive the action and commentate on what's going on. Depending on the size of the equipment required, the challenges can be played on the stage or the dance floor with roving camera streaming to the big screen and the clock on the side screens.

The challenges are as follows:

Hanky Panky

You will need 2 x large box of tissues. Remove all the tissues from the tissue box as quickly as you can using one hand and one at a time. The person to do this is the winner.

Bottom to the Top

You will need 80 x red plastic cups and 2 x Blue ones. Each participant has 40 stacked red plastic cups and 1 x Blue cup. The Blue cup starts at the bottom of the stack. When the time starts the contestants have to take each cup one by one from the top the bottom sending the golden cup up the stack. The first person to get the cups from the bottom from the top is the winner

Nose Dive

You will need a 2 x bowls of cotton wool balls, 2 x empty bowls and 2 x pots of vaseline. The game is to transfer 10 cotton wool balls from one side of the stage to the other. The contestants dunk their nose into the Vaseline bowl, then stick their nose in the cotton wool bowl in an attempt to attach a ball. The person who gets 10 balls from 1 bowl to the other is the winner.

Big Blow

You will need 30 red cups and 2 x balloons. Each contestant has 15 red cups lined on the edge of a table. Using to balloon they have to blow the cups off the table. (E.G Blow up the balloon, then use the air from the balloon to blow the cups) First person to do so is the winner.

Can – delier

You will need 30 x empty coke cans and 10 x plastic plates per team. The idea is to create chandelier using the plates and cans. Like an upside down pyramid each contestant has to stack 1 can, 1 plate, 2 cans 1 plate, 3 cans and so on until 5 cans are on top finishing with a plate. The first person to complete this is the winner, or if the minute is up the person with the highest stack wins.

Float or sink

You will need 2 x bowls of water and 10 x empty coke cans. You have to rest the plastic plate on the surface of the water and then stack 5 cans on top of each other. The first person to do it is the winner, or the person with the highest stack within the minute wins

Cups and balls

You will need 2 x paper cups and 2 x bowls of ping pong balls per team. The contestants have to flip the paper cup until it stands upright. Then just like beer pong you have to bounce a ping pong ball off the table into the cup. The person with the most amount of balls in the cup within the minute wins

Switch it up

You will need 120 ping ping balls. 10 x white and 10 x coloured (marked) balls & 4 x platter trays. The idea of this game is to sit 2 trays side by side each other per player. 1 with 5 white balls and the other with 5 x coloured (marked) balls. On go the players have get swap the white balls with the coloured balls by only blowing them. The first person to do this is the winner.

Bolt it on

You will need 16 x large bolts and 2 x kebab type skewer. Starting with all 8 bolts threaded on the skewer. Using just one hand they have the stack the bolts on their edge on top of each other using just one hand. The person to successfully stack all 8 bolts is the winner.

Pencil full of the lead

You will need 24 x pencils. Simply rest 2 pencils on the back of your hand and throw them up and catch them using the same hand. Once you successfully done that add another 2. You do this until you have caught all 12 pencils at the same time. The winner is whoever does this first.

Features

These feature length game shows are designed for adult contestants, but will also keep the kids entertained. These game shows are to be played when you are looking to fill 30 - 40 minutes. So therefore could be played when there are no cabarets booked in for the evening. Each game show has its own audio visual sequence to give it that game show feel. These games can be played on the stage in the usual set up, or out in the audience using the roaming camera. The more you can go out in into the audience the better.

Read my lips



This is a team game, 2 per team. Contestant number 1 is sat on a chair centre stage with headphones facing out to the audience and the main screen behind them. They are given a topic such as food, animals, country's etc. Contestant 1 will have to read the words that pop up on the screen behind contestant number 2 and attempt to translate the words. It is important that contestant number 1 doesn't do any actions. Contestant number 2's role is to read number 1's lips. Each round has 1 minute to guess as many words as possible. We suggest each player in the couple has a go at guessing the words. The couple with the most points after both rounds are the winners.

If they get it correct the host then asks their opponent a question. This continues until 1 player gets it wrong, if they get it wrong then they lose a life. Each person has 3 (or 5) lives. The person who stays in the longest are the winners.

Spread The Word



This is a team game, 3 per team. 3 x Adults sit along the stage sat side by side. All with headphones on playing music so they can't hear what's being said. Player number one is sat facing the screen so they can see the phrase. Once the phrase appears it is passed on down the line with host picking up the conversation with the mic. The 3rd person says out loud what they think the phrase is. If they get it right they get a point. The team with the most correct answers within a minute are the winners.

Big Star, Little Star



This game is all about how well the Big Stars know the Little Stars. Over 3 rounds the couples go head to head in a battle of the familys. You will need 3 x pairs made up of an adult and child ideally related in some way so they have some knowledge of one another. The ideal age for the child is between 6 – 10 years old. The key is to find children that are confident and outgoing.

This game will take a little time to prepare, but will be well worth it. We suggest the night before you want to play, the host announces that the following evening is going to be Big Star, Little Star therefore anyone that would like to be a part of the show then please come up and sign up. You will then organise an hour slot during that day where the 3 x children will be asked a host of questions. We suggest getting the partner of the 'Big Star' that is going to be in the show to bring the child along the questions so that A) The Big Star doesn't know what's been said, B) to help keep the child feel more at ease and C) to help dish the dirt on the participant.

The night of the show, we suggest the participants arrive 20 minutes before the scheduled show. When they arrive, invite them backstage so when they are welcomed onto the stage they are already apart of the show. It may also help each participant has a name on their person to help the host remember there names

Throughout the rounds the assistant (or DJ) keeps a tally of the scores and between each round gives an update on how each team is getting on.

Introduction

The opening sequence plays and the host comes from back stage and introduces the show. *"Hello and welcome to Big Star, Little Star. The game where we find out what family really knows each other the most. Over a course of 3 rounds our contestants are going to be trying to earn points to earn the chance to be crowned our winners. Without further or do lets meet our Big Stars and Little Stars"* After the host has had a chat with all 3 teams they move onto the first round.

Round one – Dish the Dirt

This round the little ones get sent back to their tables or the dance floor to watch their big stars answer questions based on the questions the little ones were asked earlier that day. The adult are asked 3 x questions, with the option of 4 x answers. The answer that the child gave will be amongst those 4 choices for answers. Once the adult has the given their answer we got to the big screen where the answer is played. For every answer that they get right they earn a point.

Example Questions: What is Daddy's words habbit?

Example Answers: A) Snoring when he's fast asleep
B) Picking his nose
C) Eating with his mouth open
D) Insert Childs answers

Round 2 - What are they on about?

Again during this round the Little Stars stay at their table whilst a recording (taken from earlier) is played of them describing an item of their Big Stars. Whether it's their mobile phone or their hair dryer , the little ones have to talk about that item. The key is for the descriptions is not to be too obvious so the grown up doesn't guess straight away. The Holiday Hero may need to help guide the child with this.

Round 3 – Match it

This round the Little Stars come back onto the stage to work with their Big Stars. Each couple sits back to back with pieces of card on with A, B & C. The host asks the pair a question and the pair need to match their answers. For every matched answer they get point.

At the end of the 3rd round the host asks for the total scores from the DJ and announces the overall winner

Questions

Round one – Dish the Dirt

1. What does your grown up need to practice the most?

Clash of the couples – Show 1



This game is designed for the more experienced host. This show relies on the host being not only funny, but also being sensitive to the material. 3 x couples go head to head to find out who are Away Resorts ultimate couple. This game is suitable for children, but may offend those easily offended. We suggest you pre pick the couples, maybe the ones that you have got to know over the week. Explain earlier on in the night that you are going to be playing clash of the couples and that you are looking for willing couples to get involved. For this game you will need an assistant on the stage taking notes of the answers given and tallying up the scores. We suggest having 6 chairs (in pairs) facing out to the audience with each contestants name stuck on the back of the chair so that the host doesn't forget.

Introduction

The host welcomes up the couples onto the stage and gets them to sit in their correct seats. Explain to the audience that the show is recommended for children, but adults keep them close so they can explain the jokes to the kids. The host will already know the contestants names, they go along the line asking where each couple where they are from and how long they have been together. The game works best if you can get one couple that's either newly married or engaged, a couple that's been married 5 – 10 years and an elderly couple that have been together for many years.

Round 1

The women are sent off where they can't hear the action and the men are asked the following as truthfully as possible

**On your partner's side of the family, who is the biggest the trouble maker?
What is your wife's Bra size and favourite colour? (Letters and numbers)
What colour underwear is your partner wearing tonight?**

The women are then invited back and asked the same question. The assistant will deny or confirm whether the answer is a match or not. If they match what their partners say then they get a point.

Round 2

This time the men get sent off and the women are asked a series of questions about their men

**What one thing would you make bigger, and one thing smaller?
What's the first thing your husband puts his hands on in the morning?
Where the most exciting or unusual place you have both had hanky panky?**

Again when the men come back, they are asked the same series of questions. Again the assistant will help out here. If they get a match they get a point. The couple with the most points at the end of the game are the winners

Clash of the couples – Show 2



This show is much more family friendly and more active. It is made up of 2 rounds.

Round 1

All 3 couples sit back to back along the stage. Each couple is asked a series of questions. The first time round the male is asked the questions whilst the females has right the answer down on the a white board (or pad) If the males answers match the whats on the white board then they get a point. Each couple gets asked 3 questions before swapping the pads between the male and females.

Round 2

Taking it in turns each couple will sit back to back each with a their shoes off. The host asks them 10 questions where the answer will either be him or her. The contestants simply need to raise whoe ever shoe they think the answer is. For example if the answer is her they raise her shoe etc. For every match they get, they earn a point. The team with the most matches at the end of the game are the winners

The Quest

THE QUEST

This game is based on the kids version of go fetch. Each table will be given a team number. The host will list various items that the tables will have to go and collect. The host will have an assistant who will be keep a tally of tables and scores. The beauty of the roving camera means the host can present from anywhere in the venue and the contestants have to find him to produce their items and numbers. You can also play around with some pre-recorded links, for example the host could be out of the boating lake and then re appear back inside the venue.

This game will require the whole entertainments team to bring this game to life, but if done well it can be create a real buzz in the room and a piece of entertainment that the guests will remember for a long time. The roles will be a host, a camera operator, a DJ and an assistant (DJ could possibly double up as an assistant) This game ideally wants to be played in teams of no less 5 x per team and a minimum of 8 teams to make it fun. Due to having the roving camera the host can be anywhere in the room presenting to the camera, meaning part of the fun will be the teams trying to find where the host is. Don't do this too much otherwise it may alienate those that are just watching. With the visual mixer there may also be the opportunity to replay any particular funny moments that may happen. Every time an item is asked for, an upbeat piece of music should be played.

The aim of the game is for each team to get as many points as possible. Each team should have a team captain. That team captain will have a team number. Every time the host calls for an item the team captain has to show the item and the team number to the host as quickly as possible to earn the points. The assistant's job is to listen out what team numbers the host call out and score accordingly. The scores work like so:

1st = 5 points
2nd = 4 points
3rd = 3 points
4th = 2 points
5th = 1 point

The host will announce these scores and explain that every team after 5th will earn 1 point. The reality is they won't otherwise the assistant will be there all day, but you say that to keep all of the slower teams interested.

The rules for the quest are adults only, no drinks on the dance floor, no running, pushing or shoving. When the quest requires a man only a man comes up, and the same for women. When the quest is closed then that item will no longer be accepted. After each item the quest will be closed by the host saying the quest is now closed.

Here are some examples of the items to be collected:

1. 1 x Entertainment Print off
2. A piece of fruit
3. A lady wearing men's shoes
4. Something that is fake
5. A man wearing ladies shoes
6. A picture of the queen
7. A man doing the worm
8. 3 x men's belts
9. A man and a women sharing a pair of man's trousers
10. A lady doing the splits
11. A sock with a hole in it
12. A man with a hairy back
13. A lady wearing 3 men's shirts
14. A man wearing lipstick
15. A woman's tattoo
16. A set of teeth (This could be a zip or a comb)
17. A women with man's socks over her hands
18. A scar
19. A body piercing other than the ear
20. 3 x shoe lace out of a shoe
21. 7 x men's shoes.

You can end this with a bonus round of a 100 points. Each team needs to present a man dressed as a women and then parade them around the venue to "Man I feel like a women"
