The staff member must show the participants how to steer, how to stop and how to free wheel. Staff members must ensure they brief the participants that the minimum age for the carts is 3 years The staff member must give a safety brief, to include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Not putting their feet or hands down when on the cart Participants stopping in good time to prevent running into other carts. Staff member must space carts out before commencing. Staff member should remain vigilant to ensure participants are using equipment as briefed. Participants must wear helmets, knee pads and elbow pads when on the crazy cart at all times. Staff member must ensure the helmets & PPE are fitted correctly. 	3	1	3

Cart Battery	Misuse of batteries leading to electrocution, causing burns	Team	4	2	8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Only the staff member should put the cart battery on charge and they must ensure they are dry when doing so. 	4	1	4
Over-exertion or Insufficient warm up	Muscle strains	Participants	3	2	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff member to ensure a thorough warm-up is carried out prior to the activity starting. 	3	1	3
Weather	Risk of sunburn, heat exhaustion and dehydration; or hyperthermia during activity	Team	3	2	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Ensure regular water breaks are taken. If it is hot, ensure participants wear sun cream and hats and there is a shaded area available. If it is cold, ensure participants are wearing suitable clothing to keep warm. 	3	1	3
Lost Child	Lack of supervision leading to injuries	Participants	3	2	6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Staff member to carry out regular head counts based on session bookings and remain vigilant at all times. A clear waiting area to be defined to the participants 	3	1	3
